The workshop aims to contribute to a better understanding of the links between gender-based violence and disability and to address discrimination against women with disabilities. Under the guidance of Shivani Gupta, CBM Advisor for Inclusion, and Anbreen Ajaib, Chairperson of the Pakistani women's rights organisation Bedari, you will also work out how to set up and adapt programmes and projects for the prevention of violence in an inclusive way.

Practical examples and approaches serve as further illustration. Among others, the Petze Institute for Violence Prevention from Kiel will present how women with learning difficulties in Germany can be protected from (sexualised) violence and share their experiences.
